1 **SECTION 1. INSTALLATION OF PLAQUE HONORING LAW EN-**
2 **FORCEMENT OFFICERS WHO RESPONDED TO**
3 **VIOLENCE AT THE CAPITOL ON JANUARY 6,**

7 shall, in accordance with section 214 of the Legislative
8 Branch Appropriations Act, 2022 (Public Law 117–103;
