Ms. WILLIAMS of Georgia submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for certain procedures for bringing debate to a close on any question in the House of Representatives and Senate, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This resolution may be cited as the “Majority Rule
5 Resolution”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROCEDURES FOR CONSIDERATION OF BILLS AND**
7 **RESOLUTIONS.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any provision of
9 the Rules of the House of Representatives or the Standing
10 Rules of the Senate, the House of Representatives and the

1 Senate may not require that more than a majority of the
2 Members of either House of Congress voting, a quorum
3 being present, is required to bring debate to a close on
4 any question in such House.

5 (b) RULES OF HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND
6 SENATE.—This section is enacted by Congress—

7 (1) as an exercise of the rulemaking power of
8 the Senate and House of Representatives, respec-
9 tively, and as such is deemed a part of the rules of
10 each House, respectively, but applicable only with re-
11 spect to the procedure to be followed in that House
12 in the case of the bill or joint resolution involved,
13 and supersede other rules only to the extent that it
14 is inconsistent with such rules; and

15 (2) with full recognition of the constitutional
16 right of either House to change the rules (so far as
17 relating to the procedure of that House) at any time,
18 in the same manner, and to the same extent as in
19 the case of any other rule of that House.
