CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Directing the President, pursuant to section 5(c) of the War Powers Resolution, to remove United States Armed Forces from hostilities with Iran.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring),*

3 **SECTION 1. TERMINATION OF USE OF FORCE.**

4 (a) **TERMINATION.**—Pursuant to section 5(c) of the
5 War Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1544(c)), Congress
6 hereby directs the President to remove the use of United
7 States Armed Forces from hostilities against the Islamic

1 Republic of Iran or any part of its government or military,
2 including potential ground forces in a combat role or used
3 for occupation, unless explicitly authorized by a declara-
4 tion of war or specific authorization for use of military
5 force against Iran.

6 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
7 tion may be construed to—

8 (1) prevent the United States from defending
9 itself, its Armed Forces, its diplomatic facilities, or
10 allied states from imminent attack;

11 (2) prevent the United States Armed Forces
12 from maintaining a troop presence in the region for
13 defensive purposes; or

14 (3) force the removal of United States Armed
15 Forces in the region who are not engaged in hos-
16 tilities against Iran.

17 **SEC. 2. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION RELATING TO INTEL-**
18 **LIGENCE SHARING.**

19 Nothing in this resolution may be construed to influ-
20 ence or disrupt any intelligence, counterintelligence, or in-
21 vestigative activities relating to threats in or emanating
22 from Iran or surrounding countries conducted by, or in
23 conjunction with, the United States Government involv-
24 ing—

25 (1) the collection of intelligence;

7 SEC. 3. RULE OF CONSTRUCTION RELATING TO NON-
8 AUTHORIZATION OF THE USE OF MILITARY
9 FORCE.

Consistent with section 8(a)(1) of the War Powers Resolution (50 U.S.C. 1547(a)(1)), nothing in this concurrent resolution may be construed as authorizing the use of military force.
