A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Health and Human Services from implementing, administering, or enforcing provisions relating to minimum staffing standards for long-term care facilities and Medicaid institutional payment transparency reporting.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Protecting America’s
3 Seniors’ Access to Care Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION.**

5 Beginning on the date of enactment of this Act, the
6 Secretary of Health and Human Services shall not imple-
7 ment, administer, or enforce the provisions of the final
8 rule published by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid
9 Services in the Federal Register on May 10, 2024, and
10 titled “Medicare and Medicaid Programs; Minimum Staff-
11 ing Standards for Long-Term Care Facilities and Med-
12 icaid Institutional Payment Transparency Reporting” (89
13 Fed. Reg. 40876) or any substantially similar regulation.

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
