A BILL

To require a citizenship question on the decennial census, to require reporting on certain census statistics, and to modify apportionment of Representatives to be based on United States citizens instead of all persons.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Equal Representation*
5 *Act of 2025”.*

6 **SEC. 2. CITIZENSHIP STATUS ON DECENNIAL CENSUS.**

7 *Section 141 of title 13, United States Code, is amend-*
8 *ed—*

9 *(1) by redesignating subsection (g) as subsection*
10 *(h); and*

11 *(2) by inserting after subsection (f) the following:*

12 *“(g)(1) In conducting the 2030 decennial census and*
13 *each decennial census thereafter, the Secretary shall include*
14 *in any questionnaire distributed or otherwise used for the*
15 *purpose of determining the total population by States a*
16 *checkbox or other similar option for the respondent to indi-*
17 *cate, for the respondent and for each of the members of the*
18 *household of the respondent, whether that individual is a*
19 *citizen of the United States.*

20 *“(2) Not later than 120 days after completion of a de-*
21 *cennial census of the population under subsection (a), the*
22 *Secretary shall make publicly available the number of indi-*
23 *viduals per State, disaggregated by citizens of the United*
24 *States and noncitizens, as tabulated in accordance with this*
25 *section.”.*

1 **SEC. 3. EXCLUSION OF NONCITIZENS FROM NUMBER OF**
2 **PERSONS USED TO DETERMINE APPORTION-**
3 **MENT OF REPRESENTATIVES AND NUMBER**
4 **OF ELECTORAL VOTES.**

5 (a) *EXCLUSION.*—Section 22(a) of the Act entitled “An
6 Act to provide for the fifteenth and subsequent decennial
7 censuses and to provide for apportionment of Representa-
8 tives in Congress”, approved June 18, 1929 (2 U.S.C.
9 2a(a)), is amended by inserting after “not taxed” the fol-
10 lowing: “and individuals who are not citizens of the United
11 States”.

12 (b) *EFFECTIVE DATE.*—The amendment made by sub-
13 section (a) shall apply with respect to the apportionment
14 of Representatives carried out pursuant to the decennial
15 census conducted during 2030 and any succeeding decennial
16 census.

17 **SEC. 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE.**

18 *If any provision of this Act or amendment made by*
19 *this Act, or the application thereof to any person or cir-*
20 *cumstance, is held to be unconstitutional, the remainder of*
21 *the provisions of this Act and amendments made by this*
22 *Act, and the application of the provision or amendment to*
23 *any other person or circumstance, shall not be affected.*

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
