Mr. WEBER of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

A BILL

To require the Comptroller General of the United States to submit reports to Congress on theft of mail and United States Postal Service property and other civil or criminal violations relating to the Postal Service, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Upholding a Secure
5 Postal System Act” or the “USPS Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORTS ON MAIL AND POSTAL SERVICE PROP-**
2 **ERTY THEFT.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
4 date of the enactment of this section and each year there-
5 after for 5 years, the Comptroller General of the United
6 States shall investigate nationwide patterns and instances
7 of the theft of mail, delays of mail, United States Postal
8 Service employee violations investigated by the Office of
9 the Inspector General of the Postal Service, any other
10 criminal or civil violations under the jurisdiction of the
11 Postal Inspection Service, and the theft or vandalism of
12 Postal Service property, and submit a report on each such
13 investigation to the Committee on Oversight and Govern-
14 ment Reform of the House of Representatives and the
15 Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Af-
16 fairs of the Senate.

17 (b) CONTENTS.—Any report under subsection (a)
18 shall include a description of any measures the Postal
19 Service has in place to address violations described under
20 such subsection and recommendations on how the Postal
21 Service and Congress can combat such violations.

22 (c) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out this section, the
23 Comptroller General shall consult with the Inspector Gen-
24 eral of the Postal Service and the Postal Inspection Serv-
25 ice.
