A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to establish presumptions of service connection for diseases associated with firefighting.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Michael Lecik Military
5 Firefighters Protection Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. PRESUMPTIONS OF SERVICE CONNECTION FOR DIS-**
7 **EASES ASSOCIATED WITH FIREFIGHTING.**

8 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—Subchapter II of chapter 11
9 of title 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at
10 the end the following new section:

1 **“§ 1120A. Presumptions of service connection for dis-**
2 **eases associated with firefighting**

3 “(a) SERVICE CONNECTION.—For the purposes of
4 section 1110 of this title, and subject to section 1113 of
5 this title, a disease specified in subsection (b) becoming
6 manifest in a veteran described in subsection (c) to a de-
7 gree of disability specified in subsection (d) and within the
8 period specified in subsection (e) shall be considered to
9 have been incurred in or aggravated during active military,
10 naval, or air service, notwithstanding that there is no
11 record of evidence of such disease during a period of such
12 service.

13 “(b) SPECIFIED DISEASES.—The diseases specified
14 in this subsection are the following:

15 “(1) Heart disease.

16 “(2) Lung disease.

17 “(3) Brain cancer.

18 “(4) Cancer of the blood or lymphatic systems.

19 “(5) Leukemia.

20 “(6) Lymphoma (except Hodgkin’s disease).

21 “(7) Multiple myeloma.

22 “(8) Bladder cancer.

23 “(9) Kidney cancer.

24 “(10) Cancer of the reproductive system (in-
25 cluding testicular cancer).

26 “(11) Cancer of the digestive system.

1 “(12) Colon cancer.

2 “(13) Liver cancer.

3 “(14) Skin cancer.

4 “(15) Lung cancer.

5 “(16) Breast cancer.

6 “(17) Each additional disease (if any) that the
7 Secretary determines in regulations prescribed under
8 this section—

9 “(A) warrants a presumption of service
10 connection by reason of having positive associa-
11 tion with firefighting; and

12 “(B) becomes manifest within the period
13 (if any) prescribed in such regulations in a vet-
14 eran described in subsection (c), notwithstand-
15 ing subsection (e).

16 “(c) COVERED VETERANS.—A veteran described in
17 this subsection is a veteran who—

18 “(1) is trained in fire suppression; and

19 “(2) served on active duty in a military occupa-
20 tional specialty or career field with a primary re-
21 sponsibility for firefighting or damage control for at
22 least five years in the aggregate.

23 “(d) DEGREE OF DISABILITY.—The degree of dis-
24 ability specified in this subsection is 10 percent or more.

1 “(e) PERIOD.—The period specified in this subsection
2 is within 15 years of the date on which the veteran sepa-
3 rated from active military, naval, or air service.

4 “(f) EFFECTIVE DATE OF AWARD.—The effective
5 date of an award under this section shall be determined
6 in accordance with section 5110 of this title.”.

7 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
8 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by inserting
9 after the item relating to section 1120 the following new
10 item:

“1120A. Presumptions of service connection for diseases associated with fire-
fighting.”.

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
