Ms. JACOBS (for herself, Ms. JAYAPAL, Ms. VELÁZQUEZ, Ms. TLAIB, Ms. NORTON, Mr. VARGAS, Ms. BARRAGÁN, Mr. MCGOVERN, and Ms. LOIS FRANKEL of Florida) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform, and in addition to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To prohibit the use of, and rescind, Federal funds for United States DOGE Service, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Delete DOGE Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. DEFUNDING DOGE.**

6 (a) DEFINITIONS.—

1 (1) COVERED ENTITY.—The term “covered en-
2 tity” means—

3 (A) the United States DOGE Service
4 (commonly referred to as the “Department of
5 Government Efficiency” or “DOGE”);

6 (B) the DOGE Service Temporary Organi-
7 zation;

8 (C) a DOGE Team, as defined in any cov-
9 ered executive order;

10 (D) any entity established in accordance
11 with, or to implement, any covered executive
12 order; or

13 (E) any successor entity of an entity de-
14 scribed in subparagraph (A) through (D).

15 (2) COVERED EXECUTIVE ORDER.—The term
16 “covered executive order” means—

17 (A) Executive Order 14158 (90 Fed. Reg.
18 8441; relating to establishing and implementing
19 the President’s “Department of Government
20 Efficiency”);

21 (B) Executive Order 14210 (90 Fed. Reg.
22 9669; related to implementing the President’s
23 “Department of Government Efficiency” work-
24 force optimization initiative);

1 (C) Executive Order 14222 (90 Fed. Reg.
2 11095; related to implementing the President’s
3 “Department of Government Efficiency” cost
4 efficiency initiative); or

5 (D) any successor executive order of the
6 executive orders described in subparagraphs (A)
7 through (C), establishing such Department or
8 successor entities, or implementing any initia-
9 tive of such Department or successor entities.

10 (3) COVERED INDIVIDUAL.—The term “covered
11 individual” means any individual associated with a
12 covered entity on or after January 20, 2025, includ-
13 ing an officer, employee, expert, consultant, con-
14 tractor, volunteer, or any other individual regardless
15 of title or compensation, that is of, within, or pro-
16 viding services for a covered entity, or has at any
17 point headed or controlled a covered entity.

18 (b) LIMITATION.—

19 (1) EXECUTIVE ORDER.—No Federal funds
20 may be used to implement, administer, or enforce a
21 covered executive order.

22 (2) USDS.—

23 (A) Except as provided for in subpara-
24 graph (B), Federal funds made available for the
25 United States Digital Service shall only be obli-

1 gated, expended, transferred, or otherwise made
2 available for the purposes of improving existing
3 digital service delivery across the Federal Gov-
4 ernment in the same manner as it was provided
5 on January 19, 2025.

6 (B) No Federal funds may be obligated,
7 expended, transferred, or otherwise made avail-
8 able for any project or initiative initiated by a
9 covered entity on or after January 20, 2025.

10 (3) DOGE ENTITIES.—Except as provided for
11 in paragraph (2), no Federal funds may be obli-
12 gated, expended, transferred, or otherwise made
13 available to a covered entity.

14 (4) DOGE-AFFILIATED INDIVIDUALS.—

15 (A) No Federal funds may be used by a
16 covered individual, including the use of equip-
17 ment or devices purchased or maintained using
18 Federal funds.

19 (B) No Federal funds may be used to im-
20 plement, administer, or enforce an order or di-
21 rective, or a recommendation under the color of
22 government office or employment, from a cov-
23 ered individual.

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
