A BILL

To amend section 207 of title 18 to prohibit former employees of the State Department and the Department of Defense from lobbying the Federal Government on matters of foreign military sales, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No revolving doors
5 in FMS Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. FOREIGN MILITARY SALES.**

7 Section 207(f) of title 18, United States Code, is
8 amended by—

1 (1) redesignating paragraph (3) as paragraph
2 (4); and

3 (2) inserting after paragraph (2) the following
4 new paragraph:

5 “(3) FOREIGN MILITARY SALES.—Any person
6 who—

7 “(A) is a former State Department or De-
8 partment of Defense employee and who partici-
9 pated in any program, project, or activity relat-
10 ing to foreign military sales authorized under
11 chapter 2 of the Arms Export Control Act (22
12 U.S.C. 2761 et seq.) at any time during the 3-
13 year period ending on separation from Federal
14 employment; and

15 “(B) knowingly makes, with the intent to
16 influence any Federal determination authorized
17 pursuant to such chapter, any communication
18 to or appearance before any officer or employee
19 of any Federal department or agency or Con-
20 gress to influence such foreign military sales,
21 shall be punished as provided in section 216 of this
22 title.”.

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
