3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Healthcare Freedom
5 and Choice Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. SHORT-TERM, LIMITED DURATION INSURANCE**

2 **RULE NULLIFICATION.**

3 The final interagency rule published by the Internal
4 Revenue Service, the Employee Benefits Security Admin-
5 istration, and the Health and Human Services Depart-
6 ment relating to “Short-Term, Limited-Duration Insur-
7 ance and Independent, Noncoordinated Excepted Benefits
8 Coverage” (89 Fed. Reg. 23338 (April 3, 2024)) shall
