Mr. BACON introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To direct the establishment and maintenance of a National Concussion and Traumatic Brain Injury Clearinghouse, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “National Concussion
5 and Traumatic Brain Injury Clearinghouse Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. NATIONAL CONCUSSION AND TRAUMATIC BRAIN IN-**
7 **JURY CLEARINGHOUSE.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Federal official designated
9 under subsection (b) (referred to in this section as the
10 “designated Federal official”) shall establish and maintain

1 a clearinghouse of concussion and traumatic brain injury
2 best practices, medical knowledge, appropriate certifi-
3 cation, and research, to be known as the National Concus-
4 sion and Traumatic Brain Injury Clearinghouse.

5 (b) DESIGNATION OF FEDERAL OFFICIAL.—

6 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Health and
7 Human Services, the Director of the Centers for
8 Disease Control and Prevention, and the Secretary
9 of Labor shall jointly designate one of such officials
10 to establish and maintain the clearinghouse under
11 this section.

12 (2) DEEMED DESIGNATION IN ABSENCE OF
13 AGREEMENT.—If a Federal official is not designated
14 under paragraph (1) on or before the last day of the
15 60-day period beginning on the date of enactment of
16 this Act, the Director of the Centers for Disease
17 Control and Prevention shall be deemed to be the
18 designated Federal official for purposes of this sec-
19 tion.

20 (c) DESIGN.—The designated Federal official shall
21 design the clearinghouse under this section to provide vet-
22 ted, high-quality information on concussion and traumatic
23 brain injury, and associated comorbidities—

1 (1) to medical professionals so they may access
2 reliable best-practice information to provide appro-
3 priate care for their patients; and

4 (2) to patients and other stakeholders so they
5 may—

6 (A) easily find appropriate medical profes-
7 sionals; and

8 (B) access high-quality information.

9 (d) ARRANGEMENTS WITH OTHER ENTITIES.—In
10 carrying out this section, the designated Federal official
11 may disseminate information through arrangements with
12 nonprofit organizations, consumer groups, Federal, State,
13 or local agencies, or the media.

14 (e) DEADLINE.—The designated Federal official shall
15 establish the clearinghouse under this section not later
16 than 120 days after the date of enactment of this Act.

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
