A BILL

To codify certain Executive Orders relating to critical minerals.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Securing America’s
3 Mineral Supply Act of 2025” or the “SAMS Act of 2025”.

4 **SEC. 2. CODIFICATION OF CERTAIN EXECUTIVE ORDERS**
5 **RELATING TO CRITICAL MINERALS.**

6 Each of the following shall have the force and effect
7 of law:

8 (1) Executive Order 13817 (82 Fed. Reg.
9 60835; relating to a Federal strategy to ensure se-
10 cure and reliable supplies of critical minerals).

11 (2) Executive Order 13953 (85 Fed. Reg.
12 62539; relating to addressing the threat to the do-
13 mestic supply chain from reliance on critical min-
14 erals from foreign adversaries and supporting the
15 domestic mining and processing industries).

16 (3) Executive Order 14154 (90 Fed. Reg. 8353;
17 relating to unleashing American energy).

18 (4) Executive Order 14241 (90 Fed. Reg.
19 13673; relating to immediate measures to increase
20 American mineral production).

21 (5) Executive Order 14272 (90 Fed. Reg.
22 16437; relating to ensuring national security and
23 economic resilience through section 232 actions on
24 processed critical minerals and derivative products).
