A BILL

To direct the Federal Communications Commission to incorporate into the National Broadband Map of the Commission a layer that presents data on the location of agricultural areas, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Data Broadband Re-
5 porting and Integration for Deployment in Geographically
6 Essential Areas Act” or the “Data BRIDGE Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. FCC NATIONAL BROADBAND MAP.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
3 date of the enactment of this Act, the Commission shall
4 update (and thereafter maintain) the map described in
5 section 802(c)(1)(A) of the Communications Act of 1934
6 (47 U.S.C. 642(c)(1)(A)) in a manner that incorporates,
7 as a layer of such map, data on the location of agricultural
8 areas.

9 (b) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out this section,
10 the Commission shall consult with—

11 (1) the Secretary of Agriculture, including with
12 respect to existing data of the Department of Agri-
13 culture related to the location of agricultural areas;

14 (2) the Assistant Secretary of Commerce for
15 Communications and Information;

16 (3) representatives of States; and

17 (4) representatives of other relevant stake-
18 holders (as determined appropriate by the Commis-
19 sion).

20 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

21 (1) COMMISSION.—The term “Commission”
22 means the Federal Communications Commission.

23 (2) STATE.—The term “State” means each of
24 the several States and the District of Columbia.
