A BILL

To repeal the Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform
Amendment Act of 2022 enacted by the District of Co-
lumbia Council.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Common-Sense Law
5 Enforcement and Accountability Now in DC Act” or the
6 “CLEAN DC Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF COMPREHENSIVE POLICING AND JUS-**
2 **TICE REFORM AMENDMENT ACT OF 2022.**

3 The Comprehensive Policing and Justice Reform
4 Amendment Act of 2022 (D.C. Law 24–345) is repealed,
5 and any provision of law amended or repealed by that Act
6 shall be restored or revived as if that Act had not been
7 enacted into law.

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
