Mr. DELUZIO introduced the following bill; which was referred to the
Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To require the Comptroller General of the United States to assess the competitive effects of mergers and acquisitions of defense contractors, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defense Contractor
5 Competition Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. COMPTROLLER GENERAL ASSESSMENT OF COM-**
2 **PETITIVE EFFECTS OF MERGERS AND ACQUI-**
3 **SITIONS OF DEFENSE CONTRACTORS.**

4 The Comptroller General of the United States shall
5 conduct an assessment and submit to the congressional
6 defense committees a report on the competitive effects of
7 mergers and acquisitions of defense contractors during the
8 ten-year period preceding the date of the enactment of this
9 Act that includes—

10 (1) the effectiveness of any remedy relating to
11 a merger or acquisition of defense contractors on de-
12 fense industry competition and defense industrial
13 base sustainability;

14 (2) the effectiveness of information sharing be-
15 tween the Attorney General, the Federal Trade
16 Commission, and the Secretary of Defense in the
17 merger and acquisition review process;

18 (3) an analysis of the processes used by the
19 Secretary of Defense for measuring the effect of
20 vertical integration of defense contractors on com-
21 petition, including data collection and the ability to
22 access information from defense contractors that are
23 parties to the merger or acquisition to assess anti-
24 competitive practices among defense contractors;
25 and

1 (4) implementation of previous recommenda-
2 tions of the Comptroller General, the Secretary of
3 Defense, or the Defense Science Board to enhance
4 competition among defense contractors.
