A BILL

For the relief of Miguel Lopez Luvian.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. NATURALIZATION OF MIGUEL LOPEZ LUVIAN.**

4 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

5 (1) Miguel Lopez Luvian has lived in the
6 United States of America for 27 years, and has had
7 immigration status petitions pending for most of
8 that time;

9 (2) he is the husband of a United States Cit-
10 izen, the father of three United States Citizens, and
11 the grandfather to one United States Citizen;

1 (3) Miguel Lopez Luvian has complied with the
2 requirements provided by the Department of Home-
3 land Security, and was arrested and detained at a
4 routine immigration check-in and interned at the
5 Golden State Annex in McFarland, California before
6 being deported to Mexico;

7 (4) that deportation took place in direct con-
8 travention of a scheduled court hearing, during
9 which a temporary restraining order was granted
10 which would've prevented his removal from the
11 United States of America; and

12 (5) his family, employer, and community would
13 be better served if Miguel Lopez Luvian were to re-
14 turn to his home in Livermore, California.

15 (b) NATURALIZATION.—Notwithstanding section
16 337(a) or any other provision of title III of the Immigra-
17 tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1401 et seq.), Miguel
18 Lopez Luvian shall be considered to be a naturalized cit-
19 izen of the United States as of the date of the enactment
20 of this Act and shall be furnished by the Attorney General
21 with a certificate of naturalization.

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
