Mr. HERNÁNDEZ introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources

A BILL

To require the Comptroller General to conduct a comprehensive study of the operations of LUMA Energy and Genera PR in Puerto Rico, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Puerto Rico Energy
5 Oversight and Accountability Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. STUDY REQUIRED.**

7 (a) STUDY.—Not later than 1 year after the date of
8 the enactment of this Act, and again 1 year thereafter,
9 the Comptroller General of the United States shall submit

1 to Congress the results of a comprehensive study exam-
2 ining, throughout the period beginning June 1, 2021, and
3 ending on the date of the submission of the report—

4 (1) how the operational and managerial deci-
5 sions of LUMA Energy and Genera PR have af-
6 fected project execution, contracting, and coordina-
7 tion with Federal and local authorities, Federal re-
8 covery efforts and grid improvement projects in
9 Puerto Rico;

10 (2) local government policies and administrative
11 actions that influence Federal disaster relief and
12 grid resilience efforts; and

13 (3) challenges and obstacles to efficient Federal
14 funding, oversight, and project implementation with
15 respect to the energy sector of Puerto Rico.

16 (b) RECOMMENDATIONS.—The submission required
17 by subsection (a) shall also include actionable rec-
18 ommendations to improve Federal recovery and grid resil-
19 ience efforts in Puerto Rico, including—

20 (1) steps to—

21 (A) strengthen oversight of LUMA Energy
22 and Genera PR;

23 (B) enhance coordination among Federal,
24 territorial, and local authorities; and

1 (C) ensure transparent and efficient use of
2 Federal funds;
3 (2) opportunities to—
4 (A) reduce delays in project execution; and
5 (B) establish clearer lines of accountability
6 in contracting and operations; and
7 (3) proposed measures to improve coordination,
8 accountability, long-term planning for the mod-
9 ernization and resilience of the energy grid of Puerto
10 Rico.

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
