A BILL

To ensure continued appropriations for certain Small Business Administration programs during a Government shutdown, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Funding Small Busi-
5 nesses During Shutdown Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONTINUATION OF CERTAIN SMALL BUSINESS AD-**
2 **MINISTRATION PROGRAMS DURING A GOV-**
3 **ERNMENT SHUTDOWN.**

4 There are appropriated for fiscal year 2026, out of
5 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,
6 during any period of a lapse in discretionary appropria-
7 tions with respect to the Small Business Administration
8 during such fiscal year beginning on or after the date of
9 the enactment of this section, for any 30-day period of
10 such lapse (and on a pro-rated basis if such lapse is less
11 than 30 days) to pay for the salaries and expenses nec-
12 essary to continue servicing any loans made under—

13 (1) \$500,000 for loans made under subsection
14 (m) of section 7 of the Small Business Act (15
15 U.S.C. 636(m));

16 (2) \$2,916,666,667 for loans made under sub-
17 section (a) of section 7 of the Small Business Act
18 (15 U.S.C. 636(a));

19 (3) \$1,250,000,000 for loans made under title
20 V of the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 (15
21 U.S.C. 695 et seq.); and

22 (4) \$13,775,000 for administrative expenses to
23 carry out the loan program under subsection (m) of
24 section 7 of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
25 636(m)).
