A BILL

To amend the Violence Against Women Act Reauthorization Act of 2022 to include identity theft in the grant program related to local law enforcement grants for enforcement of cybercrimes, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protect Your PIN Act
5 of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT GRANTS FOR ENFORCE-**
2 **MENT OF CYBERCRIMES AND IDENTITY**
3 **THEFT.**

4 Section 1401 of the Violence Against Women Act Re-
5 authorization Act of 2022 (34 U.S.C. 30107) is amend-
6 ed—

7 (1) in subsection (a)—

8 (A) by redesignating paragraph (3) as
9 paragraph (4); and

10 (B) by inserting after paragraph (2) the
11 following:

12 “(3) **IDENTITY THEFT.**—The term ‘identity
13 theft’ means a criminal offense applicable in the
14 area under the jurisdiction of the relevant State, In-
15 dian Tribe, or unit of local government that involves
16 knowingly transferring, possessing, or using, without
17 lawful authority, a means of identification of another
18 person.”; and

19 (2) in subsections (b) through (d), by inserting
20 “or identity theft” after “cybercrimes against indi-
21 viduals” each place such term appears.

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
