Mr. FINE introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Education and Workforce

A BILL

To require public elementary schools, public secondary schools, and institutions of higher education to treat discrimination motivated by antisemitism in an identical manner to how such school or institution treats discrimination motivated by race, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “No Antisemitism in
5 Education Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DISCRIMINATION MOTIVATED BY ANTISEMITISM.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—As a condition of receiving Fed-
3 eral funds, any public elementary school, public secondary
4 school, or institution of higher education that receives
5 Federal funds shall be required to treat discrimination by
6 students or employees, and discrimination resulting from
7 the institutional policies of such school or institution, that
8 is motivated by antisemitism in an identical manner to
9 how such school or institution treats discrimination moti-
10 vated by race.

11 (b) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-
12 tion shall be construed as—

13 (1) diminishing or infringing upon any right
14 protected under the First Amendment to the Con-
15 stitution; or

16 (2) preempting State antidiscrimination laws.

17 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section—

18 (1) ANTISEMITISM.—

19 (A) IN GENERAL.—The term “anti-
20 semitism” means a certain perception of Jews,
21 which may be expressed as hatred towards
22 Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of
23 antisemitism are directed towards Jewish or
24 non-Jewish individuals or their property or to-
25 wards Jewish community institutions and reli-
26 gious facilities.

1 (B) EXAMPLES.—The term “antisemitism”
2 includes the following examples of behavior:

3 (i) Calling for, aiding, or justifying
4 the killing or harming of Jews, often in the
5 name of a radical ideology or an extremist
6 view of religion.

7 (ii) Making mendacious, dehuman-
8 izing, demonizing, or stereotypical allega-
9 tions about Jews as such or the power of
10 Jews as a collective, especially, but not ex-
11 clusively, allegations regarding the myth
12 about a world Jewish conspiracy or of
13 Jews controlling the media, economy, gov-
14 ernment or other societal institutions.

15 (iii) Accusing Jews as a people of
16 being responsible for real or imagined
17 wrongdoing committed by a Jewish person
18 or group, Israel, or for acts committed by
19 a non-Jewish individual.

20 (iv) Accusing Jews as a people or
21 Israel of inventing or exaggerating the
22 Holocaust.

23 (v) Accusing Jewish citizens of being
24 more loyal to Israel, or the alleged prior-

ities of Jews worldwide, than to the interests of their country of citizenship.

(vi) Demonizing Israel by using the symbols and images associated with classic antisemitism to characterize Israel or Israelis, drawing comparisons of contemporary Israeli policy to that of the Nazis, or blaming Israel for all interreligious or political tensions.

(vii) Applying a double standard to Israel by requiring behavior of Israel that is not expected or demanded of any other democratic country, or focusing peace or human rights investigations only on Israel.

(viii) Delegitimizing Israel by denying the Jewish people their right to self-determination and denying Israel the right to exist.

(C) EXCEPTION.—The term “antisemitism” does not include criticism of Israel that is similar to criticism towards any other country.

(2) ESEA TERMS.—The terms “elementary school”, “institution of higher education”, and “secondary school” have the meanings given such terms
