Mr. TORRES of New York introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce, and in addition to the Committees on Armed Services, Oversight and Government Reform, and Veterans' Affairs, for a period to be subsequently determined by the Speaker, in each case for consideration of such provisions as fall within the jurisdiction of the committee concerned

A BILL

To require insurance coverage of annual lung cancer screenings for adults aged 50 to 80 at increased risk for lung cancer.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Lung Cancer Screen-
5 ing Expansion Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. COVERAGE REQUIREMENT.**

7 (a) **COVERAGE STANDARD.**—All health insurers—in-
8 cluding a group health plan, a health insurance issuer of-

1 fering group or individual health insurance coverage, and
2 all applicable Federal health programs—shall provide full
3 coverage, without cost-sharing, for annual low-dose com-
4 puted tomography (LDCT) or other appropriate lung can-
5 cer screening technologies for eligible individuals described
6 in section (3).

7 (b) PROHIBITED BARRIERS.—Coverage under this
8 Act may not be subject to—

- 9 (1) prior authorization;
10 (2) step-therapy or other utilization controls;
11 (3) frequency limits more restrictive than one
12 screening annually; or
13 (4) documentation requirements beyond those
14 included in recent evidence-based clinical guidelines.

15 **SEC. 3. ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS.**

16 An eligible individual is an adult who—

- 17 (1) is 50 to 80 years old; and
18 (2) is determined by a treating health care pro-
19 fessional to be at increased risk for lung cancer
20 based on personal, environmental, or familial risk
21 factors.

22 **SEC. 4. IMPLEMENTATION.**

23 The Secretary of Health and Human Services, the
24 Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs,
25 and the Director of the Office of Personnel Management

- 1 shall issue implementing regulations within 180 days of
- 2 enactment and ensure program-wide compliance.
