Mr. RYAN (for himself and Mr. WITTMAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Armed Services

A BILL

To accelerate accreditation and access to sensitive compartmented information facilities for industry, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ACCELERATION OF ACCREDITATION AND AC-**
4 **CESS TO SENSITIVE COMPARTMENTED IN-**
5 **FORMATION FACILITIES FOR INDUSTRY.**

6 (a) PLAN REQUIRED.—Not later than 180 days after
7 enactment of this act, the Secretary of Defense, in con-
8 sultation with other appropriate departments and agencies
9 of the Federal Government, shall submit to the congres-
10 sional defense committees a plan to accelerate the accredi-

1 tation, construction, and operational use of commercial
2 sensitive compartmented information facilities accessible
3 to private-sector entities in support of national security
4 innovation, manufacturing, and mission-critical classified
5 activities.

6 (b) ELEMENTS.—The plan required by subsection (a)
7 shall include the following:

8 (1) Recommendation of policies to authorize the
9 parallel processing of construction security plans,
10 construction, and information technology deployment
11 to reduce accreditation and approval timelines.

12 (2) An assessment of the feasibility of adopting
13 architecture and construction templates to allow for
14 shortening or eliminating portions of the construc-
15 tion security plan review and approval process.

16 (3) An evaluation of current policies regarding
17 the use of mobile Secret Internet Protocol Router
18 Network and Joint Worldwide Intelligence Commu-
19 nications System systems within accredited con-
20 tractor sensitive compartmented information facili-
21 ties, including a review of Chairman of the Joint
22 Chiefs of Staff Instruction 6211.02D.

23 (4) An assessment of the feasibility of dele-
24 gating the authority to review construction security
25 plans and associated 30, 60, and 90 percent tech-

1 nical drawings to appropriately trained sponsor-ap-
2 proved personnel within the Armed Forces, subject
3 to applicable security standards and oversight.

4 (5) A proposal to designate shared commercial
5 classified facilities as valid places to work for all
6 types of classified work authorized by the Depart-
7 ment of Defense.

8 (6) A proposal to develop and establish a se-
9 cure, centralized, digital platform for the manage-
10 ment of sensitive compartmented information facility
11 lifecycle processes, including—

12 (A) submission and tracking of construc-
13 tion security plans, requests for information,
14 fixed facility checklists, and co-use authoriza-
15 tions; and

16 (B) utilization of artificial intelligence and
17 machine-learning tools for construction security
18 plan validation, interagency compliance, and
19 document version control.

20 (7) A list of any additional authorities, appro-
21 priations, or other resources necessary to implement
22 the plan required by this section.

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
