A BILL

To direct the Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency to open applications for the Next Generation Warning System grants of the Federal Emergency Management Agency for not less than 30 days each year, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Emergency Alert
5 Grant Fairness Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. NEXT GENERATION WARNING SYSTEM.**

2 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Notwithstanding any other provi-
3 sion of law, the Administrator of the Federal Emergency
4 Management Agency shall open applications for the Next
5 Generation Warning System grants of the Federal Emer-
6 gency Management Agency for not less than 30 days each
7 year.

8 (b) **ELIGIBLE ENTITIES.**—Notwithstanding any
9 other provision of law, public broadcasting entities (as
10 such term is defined in section 397 of the Communications
11 Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 397)) shall be eligible for the Next
12 Generation Warning System grants described in sub-
13 section (a).

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
