A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to establish new, and terminate certain, advisory committees of the Department of Veterans Affairs.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Veterans Affairs Advi-
5 sory Committee Oversight Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF NEW ADVISORY COMMITTEES**
7 **OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-**
8 **FAIRS.**

9 Subchapter III of chapter 5 of title 38, United States
10 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new

1 sections (and amending the table of sections at the begin-
2 ning of such chapter accordingly):

3 **“§ 549. Veterans Health Advisory Committee**

4 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is in the Department
5 an advisory committee to be known as the ‘Veterans
6 Health Advisory Committee’ (in this section referred to
7 as the ‘Committee’).

8 “(b) MEMBERSHIP; TERMS; CHAIR.—(1) The Sec-
9 retary shall appoint the members of the Committee, in-
10 cluding the following:

11 “(A) A veteran who uses prosthetic or rehabili-
12 tative health care services of the Department.

13 “(B) An individual with expertise in prosthetics
14 or rehabilitative health care for disabled veterans.

15 “(C) An individual with expertise in geriatrics
16 or gerontology, including long-term care for vet-
17 erans.

18 “(D) An individual with expertise in environ-
19 mental health or toxic exposures described in sub-
20 chapter VII of chapter 11 of this title.

21 “(E) An individual with expertise in mental
22 health or readjustment counseling for veterans.

23 “(F) A representative of a veterans service or-
24 ganization, recognized under section 5902 of this
25 title, that represents disabled or aging veterans.

1 “(G) Other individuals the Secretary determines
2 appropriate to ensure various perspectives on vet-
3 erans’ needs for health care, across regions and pop-
4 ulations.

5 “(2) Members of the Committee shall be appointed
6 for staggered terms of two years and may be reappointed.

7 “(3) The Secretary shall designate one member of the
8 Commission to serve as Chair.

9 “(c) FUNCTIONS.—The functions of the Committee
10 are the following:

11 “(1) To advise the Under Secretary for Health
12 regarding policies and programs of the Department
13 related to health care for veterans with specialized
14 health care needs, including prosthetics and other
15 special disabilities programs, rehabilitative services,
16 and long-term care for elderly veterans.

17 “(2) To assess the efficacy of, and recommend
18 improvements to, health care furnished by the Sec-
19 retary relating to a new veteran’s readjustment to
20 civilian life, including mental health counseling and
21 outreach programs.

22 “(3) To evaluate the programs of the Depart-
23 ment that relate to health conditions related to envi-
24 ronmental or toxic exposures, and to advise on
25 emerging health hazards and appropriate responses.

1 “(4) To review the coordination of prosthetic
2 and rehabilitative research and development initia-
3 tives within the Department and with external part-
4 ners, and to recommend ways to enhance innovation
5 and information exchange.

6 “(5) To identify gaps in health care furnished
7 by the Secretary for a disabled, ill, or aging veteran,
8 and propose strategies to improve the quality, acces-
9 sibility, and equity of such health care.

10 “(d) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than July 1 of each
11 year, the Committee shall submit to the Under Secretary
12 for Health a report summarizing its activities, findings,
13 and recommendations under subsection (c). Each such re-
14 port shall include the following:

15 “(A) An review and assessment of the hospital
16 care and medical services furnished by the Sec-
17 retary, including such care and services for veterans
18 with disabilities, geriatric and aging veterans, and
19 veterans exposed to environmental hazards.

20 “(B) Recommendations for administrative or
21 legislative action that the Committee determines ap-
22 propriate.

23 “(2) Not later than 90 days after receiving each re-
24 port under this subsection, the Under Secretary for
25 Health shall submit the report, together with the Under

1 Secretary's comments and recommendations, to the Sec-
2 retary. The Secretary shall submit all such documents to
3 the Committees on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and
4 House of Representatives.

5 “(e) ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.—(1) The Secretary
6 shall provide such staff, information, and administrative
7 services as necessary for the Committee to carry out its
8 functions.

9 “(2) Members of the Committee shall serve without
10 compensation, but shall be entitled to travel expenses, in-
11 cluding per diem in lieu of subsistence, when engaged in
12 the performance of Committee duties, as authorized by
13 section 5703 of title 5.

14 “(3) The Committee shall meet at the call of the
15 Chair or the Under Secretary for Health, but not less fre-
16 quently than quarterly each fiscal year.

17 “(f) TERMINATION.—Unless renewed pursuant to
18 section 14 of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5
19 U.S.C. App.), the Committee shall terminate not later
20 than September 30, 2028. The Secretary may terminate
21 the Committee at any time before such date.

22 **“§ 550. Veterans Economic Opportunity and Transi-**
23 **tion Advisory Committee**

24 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
25 Department an advisory committee to be known as the

1 ‘Veterans Economic Opportunity and Transition Advisory
2 Committee’ (in this section referred to as the ‘Com-
3 mittee’).

4 “(b) MEMBERSHIP; TERMS; CHAIR.—(1) The Sec-
5 retary shall appoint members of the Committee, including
6 the following:

7 “(A) An individual with expertise in educational
8 benefits and programs under this title.

9 “(B) A representative of an institution of high-
10 er education or training program that serves vet-
11 erans.

12 “(C) An individual with expertise in employ-
13 ment and job training programs for veterans.

14 “(D) An individual with experience in hiring or
15 training veterans.

16 “(E) A veteran who separated from active mili-
17 tary, naval, air, or space service less than 10 years
18 before being appointed under this subsection.

19 “(F) An individual who was a homeless veteran
20 or an advocate for veterans’ homelessness prevention
21 and recovery programs.

22 “(G) Other individuals the Secretary determines
23 appropriate.

1 “(2) The term of a member appointed under para-
2 graph (1) shall be two years, staggered to ensure con-
3 tinuity. A member may be reappointed.

4 “(3) The Secretary shall designate one member of the
5 Committee to serve as Chair.

6 “(c) FUNCTIONS.—The functions of the Committee
7 are the following:

8 “(1) To advise the Under Secretary for Bene-
9 fits regarding the effectiveness of the educational
10 benefits, vocational rehabilitation, employment as-
11 sistance, and transition services furnished by the
12 Secretary in enabling veterans to successfully read-
13 just to civilian life and achieve economic stability.

14 “(2) To assemble and review information on the
15 needs of veterans in readjusting to civilian employ-
16 ment, higher education, and job training. Such infor-
17 mation shall include identified barriers that veterans
18 (including women, minority, and economically dis-
19 advantaged veterans) face in such readjustment.

20 “(3) To assess the effectiveness of the edu-
21 cational benefits, vocational training, job placement,
22 and entrepreneurship training furnished by the Sec-
23 retary in improving economic opportunities for vet-
24 erans.

1 “(4) To advise the Under Secretary regarding
2 means to improve interagency coordination and part-
3 nership between the Department and other Federal,
4 State, and local entities to promote employment,
5 skills training, and financial stability for veterans.

6 “(5) To identify and recommend strategies (in-
7 cluding early intervention, supportive services, and
8 employer outreach) to assist veterans at risk of
9 homelessness or unemployment.

10 “(d) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than March 31 of each
11 year, the Committee shall submit to the Under Secretary
12 a report on the programs and activities of the Department
13 that relate to the issues of transition, education, employ-
14 ment, and economic opportunity for veterans. Each such
15 report shall include the following, with regards to such
16 issues:

17 “(A) An assessment of the unmet needs of vet-
18 erans.

19 “(B) A review and evaluation of programs of
20 the Department designed to meet such needs.

21 “(C) A summary of the activities of the Com-
22 mittee during the preceding year.

23 “(D) Recommendations for administrative or
24 legislative action that the Committee determines ap-
25 propriate.

1 “(2) Not later than 90 days after receiving each re-
2 port under this subsection, the Under Secretary shall sub-
3 mit the report, together with the Under Secretary’s com-
4 ments and recommendations, to the Secretary. The Sec-
5 retary shall submit all such documents to the Committees
6 on Veterans’ Affairs of the Senate and House of Rep-
7 resentatives,

8 “(e) ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.—(1) The Secretary
9 shall provide such staff support, information, and adminis-
10 trative services as necessary for the Committee to carry
11 out its responsibilities.

12 “(2) Members of the Committee shall serve without
13 compensation, but may be reimbursed for travel expenses
14 and per diem in lieu of subsistence in accordance with sec-
15 tion 5703 of title 5.

16 “(3) The Committee shall meet at the call of the
17 Chair or the Under Secretary for Benefits, but not less
18 frequently than twice each year.

19 “(f) TERMINATION.—Unless renewed pursuant to
20 section 14 of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5
21 U.S.C. App.), the Committee shall terminate not later
22 than September 30, 2028. The Secretary may terminate
23 the Committee at any time before such date.

1 **“§ 551. Advisory Committee on Veterans Special Pop-**
2 **ulations**

3 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
4 Department an advisory committee to be known as the
5 ‘Advisory Committee on Veterans Special Populations’ (in
6 this section referred to as the ‘Committee’).

7 “(b) MEMBERSHIP; TERMS; CHAIR.—(1) The Com-
8 mittee shall consist of members appointed by the Sec-
9 retary for their expertise regarding the needs of histori-
10 cally underserved veteran communities. Members shall in-
11 clude the following:

12 “(A) Not fewer than two women veterans, rep-
13 resenting different service eras.

14 “(B) Not fewer than two veterans from, and
15 with experience advocating for veterans from, the
16 outlying areas of the United States or the Freely As-
17 sociated States (including American Samoa, Guam,
18 the Northern Mariana Islands, Puerto Rico, the
19 U.S. Virgin Islands, the Federated States of Micro-
20 nesia, the Marshall Islands, and Palau).

21 “(C) Individuals who are recognized authorities
22 on issues affecting minority veteran populations, in-
23 cluding—

24 “(i) at least one individual with expertise
25 in health care or benefits for women veterans;
26 and

1 “(ii) at least one individual with expertise
2 in issues regarding veterans in tribal or insular
3 area communities.

4 “(D) Such other members the Secretary deter-
5 mines appropriate.

6 “(2) The term of a member appointed under para-
7 graph (1) shall be two years, staggered to ensure con-
8 tinuity. A member may be reappointed.

9 “(3) In addition to members appointed under para-
10 graph (1), the Committee shall include, as ex officio mem-
11 bers, the following officials (or their designees):

12 “(A) The Deputy Assistant Secretary for Tribal
13 Government Relations.

14 “(B) The Director of the Center for Women
15 Veterans of the Department.

16 “(C) The Director of the Center for Minority
17 Veterans of the Department.

18 “(4) The Secretary shall designate one member of the
19 Committee to serve as the Chair.

20 “(c) FUNCTIONS.—The functions of the Committee
21 include the following:

22 “(1) To advise the Secretary on the administra-
23 tion of benefits and services for veterans who are
24 members of populations that have been historically

1 underserved, under-represented, or faced unique bar-
2 riers to access.

3 “(2) To assess the needs of such veterans with
4 respect to compensation, health care, mental health,
5 rehabilitation, outreach, and other benefits and pro-
6 grams administered by the Secretary.

7 “(3) To evaluate the extent to which programs
8 of the Department meeting needs described in para-
9 graph (2).

10 “(4) To review and make recommendations re-
11 garding reports, studies, and program data per-
12 taining to the experience of such veterans, including
13 trends in health outcomes, benefit usage rates, and
14 disparities in access or quality of services.

15 “(5) To examine and make recommendations to
16 outreach activities of the Department and strategies
17 for engaging with veterans in such communities.

18 “(6) To advise on the effectiveness of offices
19 and programs of the Department that are specifi-
20 cally charged with assisting such veterans (including
21 the Center for Women Veterans, the Center for Mi-
22 nority Veterans, and the Office of Tribal Govern-
23 ment Relations).

24 “(d) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than July 1 of each
25 year, the Committee shall submit to the Secretary a report

1 on the programs and activities of the Department during
2 the preceding year. Each such report shall include the fol-
3 lowing:

4 “(A) An assessment of the needs of such vet-
5 erans for benefits and services furnished by the Sec-
6 retary.

7 “(B) A review and evaluation of the programs,
8 activities, and research initiatives of the Department
9 designed to meet such needs.

10 “(C) Recommendations for administrative or
11 legislative action that the Committee determines ap-
12 propriate.

13 “(2) Not later than 90 days after receiving each re-
14 port under this subsection, the Under Secretary for
15 Health shall submit the report, together with the Under
16 Secretary’s comments and recommendations, to the Sec-
17 retary. The Secretary shall submit all such documents to
18 the Committees on Veterans’ Affairs of the Senate and
19 House of Representatives.

20 “(e) ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.—(1) The Secretary
21 shall provide such staff, data, and administrative support
22 to the Committee as necessary for the Committee to carry
23 out its duties.

24 “(2) Members of the Committee shall serve without
25 pay, but shall receive travel expenses and per diem for any

1 travel performed in the course of service on the Com-
2 mittee, in accordance with section 5703 of title 5.

3 “(3) The Committee shall meet at the call of the
4 Chair or the Secretary, but not less frequently than twice
5 per year. Meetings may be conducted in person or through
6 electronic means, as the Secretary deems appropriate.

7 “(f) TERMINATION.—Unless renewed pursuant to
8 section 14 of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5
9 U.S.C. App.), the Committee shall terminate not later
10 than September 30, 2028. The Secretary may terminate
11 the Committee at any time before such date.

12 **“§ 552. Advisory Committee on Former Prisoners of**
13 **War, Compensation, and Memorial Affairs**

14 “(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
15 Department of Veterans Affairs an advisory committee to
16 be known as the ‘Advisory Committee on Former Pris-
17 oners of War, Compensation, and Memorial Affairs’ (in
18 this section referred to as the ‘Committee’).

19 “(b) MEMBERSHIP; TERMS; CHAIR.—(1) Members of
20 the Committee shall be appointed by the Secretary and
21 shall include the following:

22 “(A) A veteran who is a former prisoner of war,
23 or a family member or advocates for former pris-
24 oners of war (hereinafter, ‘POWs’), to provide in-

1 sight into the experiences and needs of such vet-
2 erans.

3 “(B) Individuals who are recognized authorities
4 in fields relevant to disabilities prevalent among
5 former POWs, such as epidemiology, mental health,
6 nutrition, geriatrics, or internal medicine.

7 “(C) Representatives of veterans with service-
8 connected disabilities and experts in veterans dis-
9 ability compensation policy.

10 “(D) Individuals with expertise in memorial af-
11 fairs, funeral services, or military or veteran burials.

12 “(E) Such other individuals the Secretary de-
13 termines appropriate to ensure a comprehensive rep-
14 resentation of perspectives on compensation, POW
15 issues, and memorial matters.

16 “(2) The term of a member appointed under para-
17 graph (1) shall be two years, staggered to ensure con-
18 tinuity. A member may be reappointed.

19 “(3) The Secretary shall designate one member of the
20 Committee to serve as the Chair.

21 “(c) FUNCTIONS.—The functions of the Committee
22 are the following:

23 “(1) To advise the Secretary on the administra-
24 tion and adequacy of benefits for disabled veterans,

1 including compensation and the schedule for rating
2 disabilities.

3 “(2) To assess the needs of veterans who are
4 former POWs (including disability compensation,
5 health care, and rehabilitation) and to evaluate the
6 programs and policies of the Department meant to
7 address such needs (including presumptions of serv-
8 ice connection for former POWs, the provision of
9 specialized health care (including mental health
10 care) to such veterans, and outreach efforts to en-
11 sure former POWs are aware of and receiving bene-
12 fits).

13 “(3) To advise the Secretary on the administra-
14 tion of burial benefits and memorial programs for
15 veterans and their eligible family members, including
16 policies on burial allowances, headstones or markers,
17 and the operation of national cemeteries.

18 “(4) The review and make recommendations re-
19 garding the services and plans of the National Cem-
20 etery Administration to address the needs of vet-
21 erans and survivors.

22 “(5) To assess and make recommendations re-
23 garding the effectiveness of the programs of the De-
24 partment that commemorate and honor the service
25 and sacrifices of veterans and their families, (includ-

1 ing the maintenance of cemeteries, availability of
2 gravesites, and memorial tributes for under-recog-
3 nized groups of veterans).

4 “(6) To identify and make recommendations re-
5 garding legislative or administrative barriers that
6 hinder the ability of the Secretary to promptly and
7 fairly compensate veterans for service-connected dis-
8 abilities or to provide appropriate memorial benefits.

9 “(d) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than July 1 of each
10 year, the Committee shall submit to the Secretary a report
11 on the programs and activities of the Department during
12 the preceding year. Each such report shall include the fol-
13 lowing:

14 “(A) An assessment of the needs of veterans
15 and their survivors for disability compensation, in-
16 cluding an evaluation of whether the current com-
17 pensation structure (such as the rating schedule and
18 ancillary benefits) adequately compensates veterans
19 for the loss of earning capacity and quality of life.

20 “(B) An assessment of the specific needs of
21 former POWs for compensation, health care, and re-
22 habilitation.

23 “(C) An assessment of needs related to burial
24 and memorial services for veterans and their fami-
25 lies.

1 “(D) An assessment review of the programs
2 and policies of the Department that address issues
3 related to functions described in subsection (c).

4 “(E) Recommendations for administrative or
5 legislative action that the Committee determines ap-
6 propriate.

7 “(2) Not later than 90 days after receiving each re-
8 port under this subsection, the Under Secretary for
9 Health shall submit the report, together with the Under
10 Secretary’s comments and recommendations, to the Sec-
11 retary. The Secretary shall submit all such documents to
12 the Committees on Veterans’ Affairs of the Senate and
13 House of Representatives.

14 “(e) ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.—(1) The Secretary
15 shall provide such staff, data, and administrative support
16 to the Committee as necessary for the Committee to carry
17 out its duties.

18 “(2) Members of the Committee shall serve without
19 pay, but shall receive travel expenses and per diem for any
20 travel performed in the course of service on the Com-
21 mittee, in accordance with section 5703 of title 5.

22 “(3) The Committee shall meet at the call of the
23 Chair or the Secretary, but not less frequently than twice
24 per year. Meetings may be conducted in person or through
25 electronic means, as the Secretary deems appropriate.

1 “(f) TERMINATION.—Unless renewed pursuant to
 2 section 14 of the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5
 3 U.S.C. App.), the Committee shall terminate not later
 4 than September 30, 2028. The Secretary may terminate
 5 the Committee at any time before such date.”.

6 **SEC. 3. TERMINATION DATES OF CERTAIN ADVISORY COM-**
 7 **MITTEES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VET-**
 8 **ERANS AFFAIRS.**

9 (a) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON FORMER PRISONERS
 10 OF WAR.—Section 541 of title 38, United States Code,
 11 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
 12 section:

13 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
 14 30, 2026.”.

15 (b) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON WOMEN VETERANS.—
 16 Section 542 of title 38, United States Code, is amended
 17 by adding at the end the following new subsection:

18 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
 19 30, 2026.”.

20 (c) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON PROSTHETICS AND
 21 SPECIAL-DISABILITIES PROGRAMS.—Section 543 of title
 22 38, United States Code, is amended by striking subsection
 23 (d) and inserting the following new subsection:

24 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
 25 30, 2026.”.

1 (d) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE READJUSTMENT
2 OF VETERANS.—Section 545 of title 38, United States
3 Code, is amended by striking subsection (d) and inserting
4 the following new subsection:

5 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
6 30, 2026.”.

7 (e) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON DISABILITY COM-
8 PENSATION.—Section 546 of title 38, United States Code,
9 is amended by striking subsection (f) and inserting the
10 following new subsection:

11 “(f) TERMINATION.—The Committee shall terminate
12 on September 30, 2026.”.

13 (f) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON TRIBAL AND INDIAN
14 AFFAIRS.—Section 547 of title 38, United States Code,
15 is amended by striking subsection (i) and inserting the fol-
16 lowing new subsection:

17 “(i) TERMINATION.—The Committee shall terminate
18 on September 30, 2026.”.

19 (g) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON UNITED STATES OUT-
20 LYING AREAS AND FREELY ASSOCIATED STATES.—Sec-
21 tion 548(k) of title 38, United States Code, is amended
22 by striking “the date that is 10 years after the date of
23 the enactment of this section” and inserting “September
24 30, 2026”.

1 (h) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CEMETERIES AND
2 MEMORIALS.—Section 2401 of title 38, United States
3 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following: “The
4 Committee shall terminate on September 30, 2026.”.

5 (i) VETERANS’ ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REHABILI-
6 TATION.—Section 3121 of title 38, United States Code,
7 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
8 section:

9 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
10 30, 2026.”.

11 (j) VETERANS’ ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON EDU-
12 CATION.—Section 3692(c) of title 38, United States Code,
13 is amended by striking “December 31, 2026” and insert-
14 ing “September 30, 2026”.

15 (k) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON VETERANS EMPLOY-
16 MENT, TRAINING, AND EMPLOYER OUTREACH.—Section
17 4110 of title 38, United States Code, is amended, in sub-
18 section (h), by striking “continue until terminated by law”
19 and inserting “terminate on September 30, 2026”.

20 (l) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ACADEMIC AFFILI-
21 ATIONS.—Section 7313 of title 38, United States Code,
22 is amended by adding at the end the following new sub-
23 section:

1 “(e) Any such advisory committee shall terminate on
2 September 30, 2026. The Secretary may not establish a
3 new such advisory committee after such date.”.

4 (m) GERIATRICS AND GERONTOLOGY ADVISORY
5 COMMITTEE.—Section 7315 of title 38, United States
6 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
7 subsection:

8 “(d) The Committee shall terminate on September
9 30, 2026.”.

10 (n) PARENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR CHILD
11 CARE CENTERS.—Section 7809(e) of such title is amend-
12 ed by adding at the end the following: “Any such com-
13 mittee shall terminate on September 30, 2026.”.

14 (o) ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON STRUCTURAL SAFETY
15 OF DEPARTMENT FACILITIES.—Section 8105(b) of title
16 38, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end
17 the following new paragraph:

18 “(4) The advisory committee shall terminate on Sep-
19 tember 30, 2026.”.

20 (p) VETERANS’ ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON ENVIRON-
21 MENTAL HAZARDS.—The Veterans’ Dioxin and Radiation
22 Exposure Compensation Standards Act (Public Law 98–
23 542; 38 U.S.C. 1154 note), is amended, in section 6, by
24 adding at the end the following new subsection:

1 “(h) The Committee shall terminate on September
2 30, 2026.”.

3 **SEC. 4. REPEAL OF DEFUNCT ADVISORY COMMITTEES.**

4 (a) PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION AND LICENSURE
5 ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—Section 3689 of title 38, United
6 States Code, is amended by striking subsection (e).

7 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 30 days after the date
8 of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans

11 containing a list of advisory committees of the Department

13 (1) that are authorized and inactive; or

14 (2) for which authorization has lapsed.
