A BILL

To require the Secretary of State to revoke any United States passport issued to an individual, on receipt of a certification by the Secretary of Health and Human Services that the individual has a child support arrearage exceeding \$2,500.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Ensuring Children Re-*
 5 *ceive Support Act”.*

6 **SEC. 2. REVOCATION OF PASSPORTS ISSUED TO INDIVID-**
 7 **UALS WITH A CHILD SUPPORT ARREARAGE**
 8 **EXCEEDING \$2,500.**

9 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 452(k) of the Social Secu-*
 10 *rity Act (42 U.S.C. 652(k)) is amended—*

11 *(1) in paragraph (1), by striking “, revocation,*
 12 *or limitation” and inserting “or revocation”; and*

13 *(2) in paragraph (2)—*

14 *(A) by striking “may revoke, restrict, or*
 15 *limit” and inserting “revoke”; and*

16 *(B) by inserting “, and notify such indi-*
 17 *vidual of the intent to take such action” before*
 18 *the period.*

19 *(b) EXCEPTION.—Notwithstanding the amendments*
 20 *made by subsection (a), if an individual is abroad and*
 21 *needs to return to the United States on an emergency basis,*
 22 *the Department of State is authorized to issue a temporary*
 23 *passport for that purpose. That passport will be good only*
 24 *for the return to the United States of the individuals and*
 25 *will be limited in duration.*

1 ***SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.***

2 *The amendments made by this Act shall take effect on*

3 *October 1, 2026.*

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
