Mr. JOHNSON of South Dakota introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To eliminate the period of limitations for certain non-capital homicide offenses.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as “Kamisha’s Law”.

5 **SEC. 2. NO PERIOD OF LIMITATIONS FOR CERTAIN NON-**
6 **CAPITAL HOMICIDE OFFENSES.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 213 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
9 lowing:

1 **“§ 3302. Non-capital homicide offenses**

2 “Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an in-
3 dictment may be found or information may be instituted
4 at any time without limitation for—

5 “(1) murder in the second degree under section
6 1111;

7 “(2) voluntary manslaughter under section
8 1112;

9 “(3) attempted manslaughter under section
10 1113;

11 “(4) murder in the second degree, voluntary
12 manslaughter, or attempted manslaughter under sec-
13 tion 1114;

14 “(5) murder in the second degree, voluntary
15 manslaughter, or attempted manslaughter under sec-
16 tion 1116;

17 “(6) murder in the second degree under section
18 1118;

19 “(7) murder in the second degree, voluntary
20 manslaughter, or attempted manslaughter under sec-
21 tion 1119;

22 “(8) murder in the second degree or voluntary
23 manslaughter under section 1120; or

24 “(9) murder in the second degree or voluntary
25 manslaughter under section 1121.”.

1 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
2 for chapter 213 of title 18, United States Code, is amend-
3 ed by adding at the end the following:

“3302. Non-capital homicide offenses.”.
