A BILL

To prohibit the obligation or expenditure by the Department of Homeland Security of funds for television advertisements promoting U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “NO ICE ADs Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON CERTAIN DHS ACTIVITIES RELAT-**
2 **ING TO ICE.**

3 The Secretary of Homeland Security may not obli-
4 gate or expend any funds to produce, purchase, distribute,
5 or broadcast television advertisements that are intended
6 to—

7 (1) promote U.S. Immigration and Customs
8 and Enforcement (ICE) or any ICE program or of-
9 fice;

10 (2) recruit personnel for ICE; or

11 (3) enhance public perception, branding, or
12 image of ICE.

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
