A BILL

To amend the Consumer Financial Protection Act of 2010 to limit to \$0 the amount that the Director of the Bureau of Consumer Financial Protection may request to fund the activities of the Bureau.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defund the CFPB
5 Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. LIMITING FUNDING OF BUREAU OF CONSUMER FI-**
2 **NANCIAL PROTECTION.**

3 Section 1017(a) of the Consumer Financial Protec-
4 tion Act of 2010 (12 U.S.C. 5497(a)) is amended—

5 (1) in paragraph (1), by striking “taking into
6 account” and all that follows through the period at
7 the end and inserting “which shall be not more than
8 \$0.”;

9 (2) by striking paragraphs (2) and (3); and

10 (3) by redesignating paragraphs (4) and (5) as
11 paragraphs (2) and (3), respectively.

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
