A BILL

To amend Public Health Service Act to require community health centers to provide behavioral and mental health and substance use disorder services, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. REQUIRED PRIMARY HEALTH SERVICES OF**
4 **COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS.**

5 (a) INCLUSION OF BEHAVIORAL AND MENTAL
6 HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER SERVICES.—

1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 330(b)(1)(A)(i) of
2 the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
3 254b(b)(1)(A)(i)) is amended—

4 (A) in subclause (IV), by striking “and” at
5 the end;

6 (B) in subclause (V), by striking the semi-
7 colon at the end and inserting “; and”; and

8 (C) by adding at the end the following:

9 “(VI) behavioral and mental
10 health and substance use disorder
11 services;”.

12 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—Section
13 330(b)(2) of the Public Health Service Act (42
14 U.S.C. 254b(b)(2)) is amended—

15 (A) by striking subparagraph (A); and

16 (B) by redesignating subparagraphs (B),
17 (C), and (D) as subparagraphs (A), (B), and
18 (C), respectively.

19 (b) FUNDING.—Section 10503(b) of the Patient Pro-
20 tection and Affordable Care Act (42 U.S.C. 254b–2(b))
21 is amended—

22 (1) in paragraph (1)(K), by striking “and” at
23 the end;

24 (2) in paragraph (2)(L), by striking the period
25 at the end and inserting “; and”; and

1 (3) by adding at the end the following:

2 “(3) to be transferred to the Secretary of
3 Health and Human Services to provide enhanced
4 funding to provide the services specified in subclause
5 (VI) of section 330(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Public Health
6 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 254b(b)(1)(A)(i)),
7 \$700,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2027 through
8 2031.”.

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
