Mr. MOORE of Utah introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Energy and Commerce

A BILL

To prohibit the manufacture and conveyance of certain products for children that incorporate an artificial intelligence chatbot, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN**
4 **PRODUCTS FOR CHILDREN THAT INCOR-**
5 **PORATE ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE**
6 **CHATBOTS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Beginning on the date that is 180
8 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, no person
9 may manufacture for sale, import into the United States,
10 sell or otherwise convey to another person, offer to sell

1 or convey to another person, or distribute in commerce
2 in any manner any children’s toy or child care article that
3 incorporates as part of such toy or article an artificial in-
4 telligence chatbot.

5 (b) ENFORCEMENT.—A violation of subsection (a)
6 shall be treated as a violation of section 19 of the Con-
7 sumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2068).

8 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

9 (1) ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE; MACHINE
10 LEARNING.—The terms “artificial intelligence” and
11 “machine learning” have the meanings given such
12 terms in section 5002 of the National Artificial In-
13 telligence Initiative Act of 2020 (15 U.S.C. 9401).

14 (2) CHATBOT.—The term “chatbot” means a
15 technology that uses artificial intelligence or ma-
16 chine learning to engage in interactive conversations
17 with a user of such technology.

18 (3) CHILD CARE ARTICLE; CHILDREN’S TOY.—
19 The terms “child care article” and “children’s toy”
20 have the meanings given such terms in section
21 108(g)(1) of the Consumer Product Safety Improve-
22 ment Act of 2008 (15 U.S.C. 2057c(g)(1)).

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
