A BILL

To modify the minimum required weight of orange juice soluble solids.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defending Domestic
5 Orange Juice Production Act of 2025”.

1 **SEC. 2. REVISION OF PASTEURIZED ORANGE JUICE STAND-**
2 **ARDS.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Effective on the date of enact-
4 ment of this Act, the standard of identity for “pasteurized
5 orange juice”, established in section 146.140 of title 21,
6 Code of Federal Regulations (or any successor regula-
7 tions), shall be deemed to require finished pasteurized or-
8 ange juice to contain not less than 10.0 percent by weight
9 of orange juice soluble solids, exclusive of the solids of any
10 added optional sweetening ingredients.

11 (b) REGULATION AUTHORITY.—Nothing in this sec-
12 tion shall be construed to limit the authority of the Sec-
13 retary of Health and Human Services to promulgate regu-
14 lations to amend the standard of identity for pasteurized
15 orange juice.

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
