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## RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2189) to modernize Federal firearms laws to account for advancements in technology and less-than-lethal weapons, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 261) to amend the National Marine Sanc-

tuaries Act to prohibit requiring an authorization for the installation, continued presence, operation, maintenance, repair, or recovery of undersea fiber optic cables in a national marine sanctuary if such activities have previously been authorized by a Federal or State agency; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3617) to amend the Department of Energy Organization Act to secure the supply of critical energy resources, including critical minerals and other materials, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it  
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.  
3 2189) to modernize Federal firearms laws to account for  
4 advancements in technology and less-than-lethal weapons,  
5 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-  
6 eration of the bill are waived. In lieu of the amendment  
7 in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Com-  
8 mittee on the Judiciary now printed in the bill, an amend-  
9 ment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the text  
10 of Rules Committee Print 119–18 shall be considered as  
11 adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read.  
12 All points of order against provisions in the bill, as amend-  
13 ed, are waived. The previous question shall be considered  
14 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further  
15 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening  
16 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided  
17 among and controlled by the chair and ranking minority

1 member of the Committee on the Judiciary or their respec-  
2 tive designees and the chair and ranking minority member  
3 of the Committee on Ways and Means or their respective  
4 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

5       SEC. 2. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
6 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 261) to  
7 amend the National Marine Sanctuaries Act to prohibit  
8 requiring an authorization for the installation, continued  
9 presence, operation, maintenance, repair, or recovery of  
10 undersea fiber optic cables in a national marine sanctuary  
11 if such activities have previously been authorized by a Fed-  
12 eral or State agency. All points of order against consider-  
13 ation of the bill are waived. The amendment in the nature  
14 of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Natural  
15 Resources now printed in the bill shall be considered as  
16 adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as read.  
17 All points of order against provisions in the bill, as amend-  
18 ed, are waived. The previous question shall be considered  
19 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further  
20 amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening  
21 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and  
22 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
23 the Committee on Natural Resources or their respective  
24 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

1        SEC. 3. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
2 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3617)  
3 to amend the Department of Energy Organization Act to  
4 secure the supply of critical energy resources, including  
5 critical minerals and other materials, and for other pur-  
6 poses. All points of order against consideration of the bill  
7 are waived. The amendment in the nature of a substitute  
8 recommended by the Committee on Energy and Commerce  
9 now printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted. The  
10 bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. All points  
11 of order against provisions in the bill, as amended, are  
12 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
13 dered on the bill, as amended, and on any further amend-  
14 ment thereto, to final passage without intervening motion  
15 except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and con-  
16 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the  
17 Committee on Energy and Commerce or their respective  
18 designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

19        SEC. 4. Each day during the period from February  
20 10, 2026, through July 31, 2026, shall not constitute a  
21 calendar day for purposes of section 202 of the National  
22 Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622) with respect to a joint  
23 resolution terminating a national emergency declared by  
24 the President on February 1, 2025, April 2, 2025, July  
25 30, 2025, or August 6, 2025.
