RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President and directing the Secretary of State to transmit to the House of Representatives any record created on or after January 20, 2025, under the control of the President or the Secretary, respectively, relating to strikes on the Houthis in Yemen and the disclosure of confidential information to a journalist on the Signal application.

1 *Resolved*, That the President is requested, and the
2 Secretary of State is directed, to transmit, respectively,
3 to the House of Representatives, not later than 14 days
4 after the date of the adoption of this resolution, copies
5 of all documents, Signal application chats, charts, or ta-
6 bles, including notes from meetings, audio recordings,
7 records (including telephone and email records), cor-
8 respondence, artificial intelligence large language model
9 conversation transcripts, and any other communications
10 created on or after January 20, 2025, under the control
11 of the President or the Secretary, respectively, that refer
12 or relate to any of the following:

13 (1) The full transcript of the Signal application
14 group chat that included journalist Jeffrey Goldberg
15 and pertained to extremely sensitive and confidential
16 plans to strike the Houthis in Yemen, including all
17 messages sent to such group chat before and after
18 Mr. Goldberg entered and left such group chat.

19 (2) Information pertaining to the strikes on the
20 Houthis in Yemen.

21 (3) Coordination with partners, allies, and other
22 countries concerning such strikes.

23 (4) Legal justifications for such strikes.

24 (5) Any material produced as a result of Mr.
25 Goldberg leaving such group chat and publishing an

1 article describing his inclusion in confidential war
2 planning, including any documentation related to po-
3 tential consequences for officials who used a com-
4 mercial application to coordinate war plans, discuss
5 whether to strike the Houthis, and include a jour-
6 nalist in such group chat.

7 (6) New executive branch process reforms, safe-
8 guards, or protections implemented in response to
9 senior national security officials inviting a journalist
10 to a group chat where highly classified information
11 was discussed, considered, and planned.

12 (7) Any group chat or transcript that was used
13 to develop war plans or discuss sensitive national se-
14 curity information.

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
