RESOLUTION

Of inquiry requesting the President to transmit certain documents relating to the dangerous, unaccountable use of AI by the United States DOGE Service to jeopardize the private information and essential services of the American people.

- 1 *Resolved*, That the President is requested to transmit,
- 2 to the extent that such documents are in the possession
- 3 of the President, to the House of Representatives, not
- 4 later than 14 days after the adoption of this resolution,
- 5 in a complete and unredacted form, a copy of any docu-

1 ment, record, report, memorandum, correspondence, or
2 other communication that refers or relates to the fol-
3 lowing:

4 (1) Any artificial intelligence (AI) technology
5 newly deployed or used at a Federal agency, by or
6 at the direction of Elon Musk or an individual asso-
7 ciated with the United States DOGE Service or
8 DOGE, from January 20, 2025, to present, includ-
9 ing any associated System of Records Notice, Pri-
10 vacy Impact Assessment, or Authorization to Oper-
11 ate.

12 (2) The Federal data and sources of Federal
13 data fed into such AI technology, including any ref-
14 erence as to whether such data contains the sen-
15 sitive, personally identifiable information of Amer-
16 ican citizens.

17 (3) All individuals involved in both the policy
18 decisions and technical planning associated with the
19 feeding of sensitive Federal data to AI technology
20 from January 20, 2025, to present, including—

21 (A) individuals involved in plans to use AI
22 technology to cut payments—

23 (i) to Americans; or

24 (ii) associated with programs for
25 Americans; and

1 (B) individuals involved in plans to collect
2 and feed government contract data through AI
3 software, including any concerns raised or steps
4 taken to mitigate Elon Musk's related conflicts
5 of interest.

6 (4) Any concerns raised by Federal workers
7 that such actions by the Trump Administration vio-
8 lated the Privacy Act and the security of Americans'
9 private information.

10 (5) Any concerns raised by Federal workers
11 that such actions by the Trump Administration vio-
12 lated the Advancing American AI Act by failing to
13 publicly disclose current and planned AI use cases to
14 ensure transparency for the American people.

15 (6) Any lists of Federal expenditures, pro-
16 grams, or personnel identified by AI software for
17 freezes or cuts.

18 (7) Any analyses undertaken by any individual
19 to determine which of such AI-identified expendi-
20 tures, programs, or personnel to freeze or cut.

21 (8) Any communication or correspondence re-
22 garding—

23 (A) the legality of such freezes or cuts;

24 (B) the harms to the American people of
25 such freezes or cuts; and

1 (C) whether employees of DOGE or their
2 associates believe that legality or harm to the
3 American people are important considerations
4 in their actions.

5 (9) All individuals who managed or accessed
6 Federal data in the process of feeding it through AI
7 technology, including whether such individuals were
8 Federal workers at the time of their data manage-
9 ment or access and, if so—

10 (A) under what authority they were hired;
11 and

12 (B) what background investigation and
13 clearance processes they underwent as part of
14 the hiring process.

15 (10) All records, logs, code, certificates, and
16 configurations for all Federal IT assets, databases,
17 or repositories accessed by employees of DOGE in
18 training or deploying new AI software.

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
