Ms. OMAR (for herself, Ms. MCCOLLUM, Mr. EMMER, Ms. CRAIG, Mr. STAUBER, Ms. MORRISON, Mrs. FISCHBACH, and Mr. FINSTAD) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform

RESOLUTION

Honoring the victims and survivors of the mass shooting
at Annunciation Catholic Church and School in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Whereas, on August 27, 2025, students and parishioners gathered at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis for a mass to welcome back students on their first week of school;

Whereas their sense of peace was shattered when a shooter opened fire while they were in prayer, killing 2 children and injuring 21 others;

Whereas first responders, including the Minneapolis Police Department, emergency medical teams and caregivers at the Children's Minnesota Hospital and Hennepin

Healthcare System, and Federal law enforcement, community members, and volunteers responded with courage and compassion; and

Whereas the Annunciation Catholic community, local schools, families, and neighbors have shown strength and resilience in the face of this tragedy: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2 (1) condemns this senseless act of violence and
3 offers its condolences to the families and loved ones
4 of those killed and injured in the tragedy;

5 (2) honors the memory of the victims and
6 stands in solidarity with survivors, the Catholic community,
7 and the broader Minneapolis community;

8 (3) commends the bravery and service of law
9 enforcement, first responders, medical caregivers,
10 school and church staff, and community members
11 who acted swiftly to protect and help others;

12 (4) stands with the Annunciation community
13 and all Minnesotans in the face of this terrible tragedy;
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15 (5) expresses hope that the Annunciation community,
16 together with other communities scarred by
17 violence across the country, will heal through unity,
18 compassion, and shared faith;

19 (6) declares that there is no place for violence
20 in our communities, and that everyone deserves to

1 feel safe in their sacred places of worship and
2 schools; and

3 (7) expresses solidarity with all faith commu-
4 nities and schools that have been scarred by such vi-
5 olence.

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
