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# RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3898) to amend

the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to make targeted reforms with respect to waters of the United States and other matters, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3383) to amend the Investment Company Act of 1940 with respect to the authority of closed-end companies to invest in private funds; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3638) to direct the Secretary of Energy to prepare periodic assessments and submit reports on the supply chain for the generation and transmission of electricity, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3628) to amend the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978 to add a standard related to State consideration of reliable generation, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3668) to promote interagency coordination for reviewing certain authorizations under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, and for other purposes; providing for consideration of the bill (S. 1071) to require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to disinter the remains of Fernando V. Cota from Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery, Texas, and for other purposes; and for other purposes.

1       *Resolved*, That at any time after adoption of this reso-  
2 lution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule  
3 XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee of  
4 the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-  
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3898) to amend the Federal Water  
6 Pollution Control Act to make targeted reforms with re-  
7 spect to waters of the United States and other matters,  
8 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall

1 be dispensed with. All points of order against consider-  
2 ation of the bill are waived. General debate shall be con-  
3 fined to the bill and amendments specified in this section  
4 and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-  
5 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the  
6 Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure or their  
7 respective designees. After general debate the bill shall be  
8 considered for amendment under the five-minute rule. The  
9 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
10 the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure now  
11 printed in the bill shall be considered as adopted in the  
12 House and in the Committee of the Whole. The bill, as  
13 amended, shall be considered as the original bill for the  
14 purpose of further amendment under the five-minute rule  
15 and shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
16 provisions in the bill, as amended, are waived. No further  
17 amendment to the bill, as amended, shall be in order ex-  
18 cept those printed in part A of the report of the Com-  
19 mittee on Rules accompanying this resolution. Each such  
20 further amendment may be offered only in the order print-  
21 ed in the report, may be offered only by a Member des-  
22 igned in the report, shall be considered as read, shall  
23 be debatable for the time specified in the report equally  
24 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,  
25 shall not be subject to amendment, and shall not be sub-

1 ject to a demand for division of the question in the House  
2 or in the Committee of the Whole. All points of order  
3 against such further amendments are waived. At the con-  
4 clusion of consideration of the bill for amendment the  
5 Committee shall rise and report the bill, as amended, to  
6 the House with such further amendments as may have  
7 been adopted. The previous question shall be considered  
8 as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any further  
9 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening  
10 motion except one motion to recommit.

11       SEC. 2. At any time after adoption of this resolution  
12 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,  
13 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the  
14 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration  
15 of the bill (H.R. 3383) to amend the Investment Company  
16 Act of 1940 with respect to the authority of closed-end  
17 companies to invest in private funds. The first reading of  
18 the bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against  
19 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall  
20 be confined to the bill and amendments specified in this  
21 section and shall not exceed one hour equally divided and  
22 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
23 the Committee on Financial Services or their respective  
24 designees. After general debate the bill shall be considered  
25 for amendment under the five-minute rule. In lieu of the

1 amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by  
2 the Committee on Financial Services now printed in the  
3 bill, an amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting  
4 of the text of Rules Committee Print 119–15 shall be con-  
5 sidered as adopted in the House and in the Committee  
6 of the Whole. The bill, as amended, shall be considered  
7 as the original bill for the purpose of further amendment  
8 under the five-minute rule and shall be considered as read.  
9 All points of order against provisions in the bill, as amend-  
10 ed, are waived. No further amendment to the bill, as  
11 amended, shall be in order except those printed in part  
12 B of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
13 this resolution. Each such further amendment may be of-  
14 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-  
15 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall  
16 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-  
17 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the  
18 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-  
19 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division  
20 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the  
21 Whole. All points of order against such further amend-  
22 ments are waived. At the conclusion of consideration of  
23 the bill for amendment the Committee shall rise and re-  
24 port the bill, as amended, to the House with such further  
25 amendments as may have been adopted. The previous

1 question shall be considered as ordered on the bill, as  
2 amended, and on any further amendment thereto to final  
3 passage without intervening motion except one motion to  
4 recommit.

5       SEC. 3. At any time after adoption of this resolution  
6 the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of rule XVIII,  
7 declare the House resolved into the Committee of the  
8 Whole House on the state of the Union for consideration  
9 of the bill (H.R. 3638) to direct the Secretary of Energy  
10 to prepare periodic assessments and submit reports on the  
11 supply chain for the generation and transmission of elec-  
12 tricity, and for other purposes. The first reading of the  
13 bill shall be dispensed with. All points of order against  
14 consideration of the bill are waived. General debate shall  
15 be confined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equal-  
16 ly divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minor-  
17 ity member of the Committee on Energy and Commerce  
18 or their respective designees. After general debate the bill  
19 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute  
20 rule. The bill shall be considered as read. All points of  
21 order against provisions in the bill are waived. No amend-  
22 ment to the bill shall be in order except those printed in  
23 part C of the report of the Committee on Rules accom-  
24 panying this resolution. Each such amendment may be of-  
25 fered only in the order printed in the report, may be of-

1 fered only by a Member designated in the report, shall  
2 be considered as read, shall be debatable for the time spec-  
3 ified in the report equally divided and controlled by the  
4 proponent and an opponent, shall not be subject to amend-  
5 ment, and shall not be subject to a demand for division  
6 of the question in the House or in the Committee of the  
7 Whole. All points of order against such amendments are  
8 waived. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for  
9 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill  
10 to the House with such amendments as may have been  
11 adopted. The previous question shall be considered as or-  
12 dered on the bill and amendments thereto to final passage  
13 without intervening motion except one motion to recom-  
14 mit.

15       SEC. 4. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
16 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3628)  
17 to amend the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of  
18 1978 to add a standard related to State consideration of  
19 reliable generation, and for other purposes. All points of  
20 order against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill  
21 shall be considered as read. All points of order against  
22 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question  
23 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any  
24 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening  
25 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and

1 controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of  
2 the Committee on Energy and Commerce or their respec-  
3 tive designees; (2) the further amendment printed in part  
4 D of the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying  
5 this resolution, if offered by the Member designated in the  
6 report, which shall be in order without intervention of any  
7 point of order, shall be considered as read, shall be sepa-  
8 rately debatable for the time specified in the report equally  
9 divided and controlled by the proponent and an opponent,  
10 and shall not be subject to a demand for division of the  
11 question; and (3) one motion to recommit.

12       SEC. 5. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
13 in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R. 3668)  
14 to promote interagency coordination for reviewing certain  
15 authorizations under section 3 of the Natural Gas Act,  
16 and for other purposes. All points of order against consid-  
17 eration of the bill are waived. The bill shall be considered  
18 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill  
19 are waived. The previous question shall be considered as  
20 ordered on the bill and on any amendment thereto to final  
21 passage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour  
22 of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and  
23 ranking minority member of the Committee on Energy  
24 and Commerce or their respective designees; and (2) one  
25 motion to recommit.

1        SEC. 6. Upon adoption of this resolution it shall be  
2 in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 1071) to  
3 require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to disinter the  
4 remains of Fernando V. Cota from Fort Sam Houston Na-  
5 tional Cemetery, Texas, and for other purposes. All points  
6 of order against consideration of the bill are waived. An  
7 amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the  
8 text of Rules Committee Print 119–16 shall be considered  
9 as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered as  
10 read. All points of order against provisions in the bill, as  
11 amended, are waived. The previous question shall be con-  
12 sidered as ordered on the bill, as amended, and on any  
13 further amendment thereto, to final passage without inter-  
14 vening motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally di-  
15 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority  
16 member of the Committee on Armed Services or their re-  
17 spective designees; and (2) one motion to commit.

18        SEC. 7. The chair of the Committee on Armed Serv-  
19 ices and the chair of the Permanent Select Committee on  
20 Intelligence may insert in the Congressional Record not  
21 later than December 12, 2025, such material as they may  
22 deem explanatory of S. 1071.

23        SEC. 8. Notwithstanding clause 13 of rule I, on any  
24 legislative day of the second session of the One Hundred  
25 Nineteenth Congress before January 6, 2026— (a) the

- 1 Speaker may dispense with organizational and legislative
- 2 business; and (b) the Journal of the proceedings of the
- 3 previous day shall be considered as approved if applicable.
