Mr. DAINES (for himself, Mr. FETTERMAN, Mr. CASSIDY, Mr. KENNEDY, Ms. MURKOWSKI, and Mr. SHEEHY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

A BILL

To require the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to extend the time period during which licensees are required to commence construction of certain hydropower projects.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF TIME TO COMMENCE CON-**
4 **STRUCTION OF CERTAIN HYDROPOWER**
5 **PROJECTS.**

6 (a) DEFINITION OF COVERED PROJECT.—In this sec-
7 tion, the term “covered project” means a hydropower

1 project with respect to which the Federal Energy Regu-
2 latory Commission issued a license before March 13, 2020.

3 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF EXTENSION.—Notwith-
4 standing section 13 of the Federal Power Act (16 U.S.C.
5 806), on the request of a licensee of a covered project,
6 the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission may, after
7 reasonable notice and for good cause shown, extend in ac-
8 cordance with subsection (c) the period during which the
9 licensee is required to commence construction of the cov-
10 ered project for not more than an additional 6 years be-
11 yond the 8 years authorized by that section.

12 (c) PERIOD OF EXTENSION.—An extension of time
13 to commence construction of a covered project under sub-
14 section (b) shall—

15 (1) consist of not more than 3 consecutive 2-
16 year periods;

17 (2) begin on the date on which the final exten-
18 sion of the period for commencement of construction
19 granted to the licensee under section 13 of the Fed-
20 eral Power Act (16 U.S.C. 806) expires; and

21 (3) end on the date that is not more than 6
22 years after the latest date to which the Federal En-
23 ergy Regulatory Commission is authorized to extend
24 the period for commencement of construction under
25 that section.

1 (d) REINSTATEMENT OF EXPIRED LICENSE.—If the
2 time period required under section 13 of the Federal
3 Power Act (16 U.S.C. 806) to commence construction of
4 a covered project expires after December 31, 2023, and
5 before the date of enactment of this Act—

6 (1) the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission
7 may reinstate the license for the applicable project
8 effective as of the date of expiration of the license;
9 and

10 (2) the extension authorized under subsection
11 (b) shall take effect on the date of that expiration.

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
