A BILL

To require the Administrator of the Small Business Administration to improve access to disaster assistance for individuals located in rural areas, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rural Small Business
5 Resilience Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. ACCESS TO DISASTER ASSISTANCE FOR INDIVID-**
2 **UALS LOCATED IN RURAL AREAS.**

3 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment
4 of this Act, the Administrator of the Small Business Ad-
5 ministration shall ensure that the Associate Administrator
6 of the Office of Disaster Recovery and Resilience of the
7 Administration takes such actions as necessary to ensure
8 that individuals located in rural areas (as defined in para-
9 graph (16) of section 7(b) of the Small Business Act (15
10 U.S.C. 636(b)(16))) for which a disaster declaration has
11 been made under such section 7(b) have full access to as-
12 sistance provided under such section, including by pro-
13 viding targeted outreach and marketing materials to those
14 individuals.

15 **SEC. 3. TECHNICAL AMENDMENT.**

16 The second paragraph (16) (relating to the statute
17 of limitations) of section 7(b) of the Small Business Act
18 (15 U.S.C. 636(b)) is redesignated as paragraph (17).
