Ms. COLLINS (for herself, Ms. SMITH, and Mr. KING) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

A BILL

To reauthorize the Kay Hagan Tick Act, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Kay Hagan Tick Reau-
5 thorization Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF PROGRAMS.**

7 (a) NATIONAL STRATEGY AND REGIONAL CENTERS
8 OF EXCELLENCE IN VECTOR-BORNE DISEASE.—Section
9 317U of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247b–
10 23) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (b), in the matter preceding
2 paragraph (1), by striking “the Tick-Borne Disease
3 Working Group established under section 2062 of
4 the 21st Century Cures Act (42 U.S.C. 284s) and
5 other individuals, as appropriate” and inserting “ap-
6 propriate individuals”; and

7 (2) in subsection (f), by striking “\$10,000,000
8 for each of fiscal years 2021 through 2025” and in-
9 serting “\$8,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2026
10 through 2030”.

11 (b) ENHANCED SUPPORT TO ASSIST HEALTH DE-
12 PARTMENTS IN ADDRESSING VECTOR-BORNE DIS-
13 EASES.—Section 2822(e) of the Public Health Service Act
14 (42 U.S.C. 300hh–32(c)) is amended by striking
15 “\$20,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2021 through 2025”
16 and inserting “\$19,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2026
17 through 2030”.

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
