A BILL

To amend section 7014 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to advance toward full Federal funding for impact aid, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT TO ESEA.**

4 Section 7014 of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-
5 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7714) is amended by strik-
6 ing subsections (a) through (d) and inserting the fol-
7 lowing:

8 “(a) PAYMENTS FOR FEDERAL ACQUISITION OF
9 REAL PROPERTY.—For the purpose of making payments

1 under section 7002, there are authorized to be appro-
 2 priated—

3 “(1) \$90,313,000 for fiscal year 2026;

4 “(2) \$102,313,000 for fiscal year 2027;

5 “(3) \$114,313,000 for fiscal year 2028;

6 “(4) \$126,313,000 for fiscal year 2029;

7 “(5) \$138,313,000 for fiscal year 2030; and

8 “(6) \$150,313,000 for fiscal year 2031.

9 “(b) BASIC PAYMENTS; PAYMENTS FOR HEAVILY IM-
 10 PACTED LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—For the pur-
 11 pose of making payments under section 7003(b), there are
 12 authorized to be appropriated—

13 “(1) \$1,632,476,041 for fiscal year 2026;

14 “(2) \$1,796,710,082 for fiscal year 2027;

15 “(3) \$1,960,944,123 for fiscal year 2028;

16 “(4) \$2,125,178,164 for fiscal year 2029;

17 “(5) \$2,289,412,205 for fiscal year 2030; and

18 “(6) \$2,453,646,246 for fiscal year 2031.

19 “(c) PAYMENTS FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABIL-
 20 ITIES.—For the purpose of making payments under sec-
 21 tion 7003(d), there are authorized to be appropriated—

22 “(1) \$60,316,000 for fiscal year 2026;

23 “(2) \$72,316,000 for fiscal year 2027;

24 “(3) \$84,316,000 for fiscal year 2028;

25 “(4) \$96,316,000 for fiscal year 2029;

1 “(5) \$108,316,000 for fiscal year 2030; and

2 “(6) \$120,316,000 for fiscal year 2031.

3 “(d) CONSTRUCTION.—For the purpose of carrying
4 out section 7007, there are authorized to be appro-
5 priated—

6 “(1) \$22,906,000 for fiscal year 2026;

7 “(2) \$27,406,000 for fiscal year 2027;

8 “(3) \$31,906,000 for fiscal year 2028;

9 “(4) \$36,406,000 for fiscal year 2029;

10 “(5) \$40,906,000 for fiscal year 2030; and

11 “(6) \$45,406,000 for fiscal year 2031.”.

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
