A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to convey certain Bureau of Land Management land to the city of Price, Utah, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Upper Price River Wa-
5 tershed Project Act of 2025”.

6 **SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7 In this Act:

8 (1) CITY.—The term “City” means the city of
9 Price, Utah.

1 (2) FEDERAL LAND.—The term “Federal land”
2 means the approximately 124.23 acres of Bureau of
3 Land Management land in the State of Utah de-
4 picted as “Proposed Conveyance Parcels” on the
5 Map.

6 (3) MAP.—The term “Map” means the map
7 prepared by the Bureau of Land Management enti-
8 tled “Land Conveyance near Price, Utah” and dated
9 May 8, 2025.

10 (4) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
11 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-
12 rector of the Bureau of Land Management.

13 **SEC. 3. CONVEYANCE OF CERTAIN BUREAU OF LAND MAN-**
14 **AGEMENT LAND TO THE CITY OF PRICE,**
15 **UTAH.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding sections 202 and
17 203 of the Federal Land Policy and Management Act of
18 1976 (43 U.S.C. 1712, 1713) and subject to valid existing
19 rights, at the request of the City, the Secretary shall con-
20 vey to the City all right, title, and interest of the United
21 States in and to the Federal land, to be used by the City
22 for public purposes, as defined by the City.

23 (b) MAP.—

1 (1) AVAILABILITY.—The Map shall be on file
2 and available for public inspection in the appropriate
3 offices of the Bureau of Land Management.

4 (2) MINOR ERRORS.—The Secretary may cor-
5 rect any minor errors in the Map.
