A BILL

To amend the Controlled Substances Act to allow for the use of telehealth in substance use disorder treatment, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Telehealth Response
5 for E-prescribing Addiction Therapy Services Act” or the
6 “TREATS Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. TELEHEALTH FOR SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER**
2 **TREATMENT.**

3 Section 309(e)(2) of the Controlled Substances Act
4 (21 U.S.C. 829(e)(2)) is amended—

5 (1) in subparagraph (A)(i)—

6 (A) by striking “at least 1 in-person med-
7 ical evaluation” and inserting the following: “at
8 least—

9 “(I) 1 in-person medical evalua-
10 tion”; and

11 (B) by adding at the end the following:

12 “(II) for purposes of prescribing
13 a controlled substance in schedule III,
14 IV, or V that has been approved by
15 the Food and Drug Administration
16 for the treatment of a substance use
17 disorder, 1 telehealth evaluation of the
18 patient; or”; and

19 (2) by adding at the end the following:

20 “(D) The term ‘telehealth evaluation’
21 means a medical evaluation that is conducted in
22 accordance with applicable Federal and State
23 laws by a practitioner (other than a phar-
24 macist) who is at a location remote from the
25 patient and is communicating with the patient,
26 or a practitioner who is treating the patient,

1 using a telecommunications system referred to
2 in section 1834(m) of the Social Security Act
3 (42 U.S.C. 1395m(m)) that includes audio-only
4 or audio and video equipment permitting two-
5 way, real-time interactive communication be-
6 tween the distant site practitioner and the pa-
7 tient, or the practitioner who is treating the pa-
8 tient.”.
