3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Detection Equipment
5 and Technology Evaluation to Counter the Threat of

1 Nitazenes Act of 2025” or the “DETECT Nitazenes Act
2 of 2025”.

3 **SEC. 2. ENHANCING THE CAPACITY TO DETECT AND IDEN-**
4 **TIFY DRUGS SUCH AS NITAZENES.**

5 Section 302(15) of the Homeland Security Act of
6 2002 (6 U.S.C. 182(15)) is amended, in the matter pre-
7 ceding subparagraph (A), by striking “fentanyl and
8 xylazine” and inserting “fentanyl, xylazine, and
9 nitazenes”.

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
